Modbury's Neighbourhood Plan Overwhelmingly Approved

Started in early 2015, the Neighbourhood Plan (NP) was finally put to the vote on Thursday 9th March by the people of Modbury. Turnout was 28% which was considered good by comparison with other NPs in the South Hams.

The count, which took place at Follaton House the following day, was witnessed by a team of four from Modbury including: Peter Watts, Ann Turner, Alison Wood and Colin Whybrow, plus District Councillor Bernard Taylor.

After an anxious wait, Deputy Counting Officer, Helen Jones was able to declare that the Neighbourhood Plan had been approved with 84.8% voting yes and just 15.2% against; an emphatic vote in favour.

After the result was announced, Neighbourhood Plan Chair and Parish Councillor, Ann Turner, said: "This is a real vote of confidence in our plan and will enable Modbury to have far more influence over planning applications that come forward for approval. But the plan covers so much more. Extensive consultation with the community, over a period of eight years, has resulted in a Neighbourhood Plan that truly reflects the community's vision of how Modbury should evolve in the years ahead."

Ann acknowledged that the plan had been a big team effort, made possible only by years of tireless hard work. She thanked

all those on the Neighbourhood Plan Group and the Parish Council's NP Committee for their sustained commitment to getting the job done and done well. "Now all that effort will be rewarded by the people of Modbury having a bigger say in the future that they want to shape" she said.



MODBURY PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Modbury Parish Council Meeting Tuesday 7th March 2023, 7.00 pm, The Pavilion, QEII Recreation Field



Nine members of the Parish Council were present along with the SHDC District Councillor and Devon County Councillor and ten members of the public.

Open Forum: A representative from Baker Estates read out a statement regarding the proposed development at Penn Parks which was to be discussed later in the meeting. He also stated that they were aware of the concerns about pedestrian access to the site. Rufus Gilbert, the Devon County Councillor, stated that at present Devon County Council, due to some concerns, is opposed to the development, but a further meeting between DCC and Baker Estates is planned to discuss these concerns.

Another member of the public raised a concern about the lack of a bus between Modbury and Ivybridge, mainly for school children, so that they can attend after school clubs. The Devon Councillor expressed support, but at the present Devon Council are struggling to keep the existing bus services running.

A further member of the public raised the issue of the poor state of repair for an area of land known as 'The Patch' in Tuckers Brook and stated that there is unsafe play equipment in the area. They understood that 'The Patch' was part of the Millennium Meadow as far as funding for maintenance was concerned and therefore the responsibility of the Parish Council.

0384/23/OPA Penn Parks As DCC have not yet resolved their concerns about this application, it was

proposed to defer discussion until after DCC and Baker Estates have had a meeting. A special Modbury Parish Council meeting will be called to discuss this.

Finance: A £500 grant for Modbury Caring for the year 2023-24 was approved.

Maintenance: The responsibility for maintenance of the 'The Patch' at Tuckers Brook is to be investigated urgently and appropriate action taken.

Sustainability: Meetings are continuing with other local councils concerning the water quality of the River Erme. A letter is to be written to our local MP expressing the Council's concerns about the water quality of the river.

It was agreed that a joint team of Parish Councillors and traders would be set up.

Homes for Ukraine Sponsorship Scheme – can you help?

As the terrible war in Ukraine grinds on into its second year, the millions of displaced refugees face a further wait for a return to normality.

At the time of writing, 275,000 visa applications had been received by the Home Office, 221,000 had been issued and there had been 166,000 arrivals in the UK. The main route for Ukrainian refugees into the country is the Homes for Ukraine Sponsorship scheme and there are currently 1,773 living in Devon of which 216 are residing in the South Hams and 9 are living here in Modbury.

Under the Sponsorship Scheme, refugee families are matched with UK households, known as sponsors, who undertake to provide them with rent-free accommodation for a minimum of six months. A tax-free thank you payment of between £350 and £500 per month is paid by the local authority to the hosts. Ukrainian guests are able to register for health and public services, benefits and for work.



Throughout the country, there is a need for more residents to become sponsors, but we have been specifically approached by South Hams DC to enquire whether there are any Modbury residents willing to become sponsors to take re-matched guests or new visa applicants. For instance, the 63-year-old mother of one of our Ukrainian guests is currently waiting in Rome for a sponsor in the local area.



The right to hold a nine-day Fair was granted to Modbury in 1329. The Charter, which was read annually by the Portreeve on May 3rd, the eve of the old St. George's Day, announced the commencement of the Fair and traditionally allowed various relaxations of the Country's Laws. This freedom was symbolized by the Glove, which, on a pole surrounded by flowers, was hung on the building that was the Bell Inn in Broad Street. The Fair was re-established in 1971. The Town Crier reads the Charter and the Glove is still hung on the same building.

Modbury's very own Town Crier, David Scott, will officiate and herald the events throughout the Fair.

In this Coronation year, the theme is Countries of the Commonwealth. King Charles III is head of the Commonwealth.



Completion of Landscaping at Palm Cross Within Sight

Residents at Palm Cross will have received notification from Bloor Homes of maintenance and remedial work being carried out at various locations on the estate.

There is now a detailed schedule of this work with provisional time lines, as some work is subject to suitable weather conditions prevailing.

An Apothecral Tale: Novum stagnum in Roslin Villa

Vernum

I had expected springtime at the new pond at Roslin Cottage to be announced first by the **winter aconite**. Instead, the first to greet me at my morning visit to the pond was a **snowdrop**.

<u>Galanthus</u> nivalis, it seems, is not native to this country. It was first documented as growing wild in the 18th century. I cannot see any reference to snowdrops in Nicholas Culpeper's Complete Herbal (written around 1649). Although this plant has been used as a traditional medicine since ancient times, it has only recently become a commercial proposition.



The alkaloid galantamine was first extracted from the snowdrop in the early 1950s after a Bulgarian pharmacologist saw remote villagers rubbing their forehead with the plant leaves and bulbs. Galantamine is a competitive, reversible, acetylcholinesterase inhibitor that increases brain acetylcholine, a chemical of great importance in cerebral function.

Galantamine was first officially approved for use as a drug in Bulgaria in 1958, and it was approved in this country around 1990s. It is largely used as a memory improvement supplement for sufferers of Alzheimer's disease and mild dementia. It is also present in other spring flowers such as daffodils.

The Messenger Visits the Modbury Health Centre

If any one service in Modbury was especially affected by the recent pandemic, it surely has to be the Health Centre. Here all the staff were affected in three ways – they could, and some did, contract the disease, they continued supplying help to those with Covid and all the other medical problems, and on top of this they had to function in a very restricted way during those strange years. Telephone and 'through the window' consultations were the norm during this time. Since the pandemic, there is a feeling that it seems more difficult to book a face to face appointment with a doctor, so I thought I would have a chat with the Practice Manager, Louise Killick, and find out how life is now, in this very vital service in our town.



My first impression on entering the reception area was one of a spacious, attractive, calm room with only one person waiting at 11 am, but I soon had this impression quelled. I asked Clare in reception how things were and she said "challenging". That was also the first word Louise used so life in the Health Centre must be like a swimming duck – all peaceful on the surface but some frantic paddling going on unseen. I asked Louise about this and out came the first statistics. There are 6 doctors, with 3 in attendance each day, 2 nurses, Jan & Anita (Helen has just retired after 40ish years there), and 2 health care assistants, Wendy & Tanya. There are also pharmacists, 6 receptionists manning reception from 8 am to 6 pm, and various other helpers, making a total of 16 plus the doctors. It is obviously a well staffed, busy Health Centre.



So why does it seem difficult to book a face to face appointment? I asked if, with the number of new houses in Palm Green, there were too many patients? The answer was no; the practice list stands at 4,800 with capacity to take additional patients if more houses are built. It caters for a large area from south of lvybridge, west to Yealmpton, east to Salcombe, and south to Bigbury. Louise explained that they couldn't take patients from outside of this area as there were occasions when patients had to be seen at home. Debbie printed me some statistics showing that over the last 12 months, the practice carried out 37,232 patient appointments, of which 21,616 were face to face, and 16,125 were 'on the day appointments' (seen or telephoned). Some 871 people failed to attend appointments they had booked (that's over 3 every working day!). This number of appointments

covers both telephone and face to face; the telephone call with the doctor allows them to assess accurately the need to be seen, and acts like a triage assessment. If it's urgent, a rapid appointment is made (not necessarily with one's usual doctor if not there), if not, a later appointment or advice will often sort the problem out.

What I realised is that in addition to all these appointments, the Health Centre also carries out many other functions which all take doctors' (and other staff) time. In an average **month**, as well as appointments, the doctors deal with 184 referrals, issue 8,286 prescriptions, deal with 1,332 incoming documents, and some 1,826 blood tests are taken and interpreted. Louise then mentioned the myriad of holiday makers who have to be cared for in addition to locals in the summer.

The NHS is the world's first national health system to commit to Net Zero which means that the output of carbon emissions produced by the NHS is neutralised by the amount the NHS will remove from the environment. Modbury Health Centre has already taken this on board and is working towards it. Inhalers are a big problem and produce large amounts of CO2 when used, so they are working on ways to reduce this by advice and design, they shred their paperwork, staff take their own stuff home to recycle as business waste doesn't cover this, they're looking at replacing the gas boilers, improving insulation, replacing bulbs with LED ones, sending out texts for appointments etc... Louise is also considering setting up Patient Groups to become involved and give feedback.

I left with a much greater understanding of the level of work that our Health Centre has to get through, with an atmosphere of calm, which is essential, and appreciated. Louise put a lot of this down to the fact that all the staff are friendly and caring (as a patient I agree with that), and said that they felt lucky in that they have kind patients. Life would be easier if there were more health workers of all grades available, but we all know about the shortages in the NHS. We are lucky, in my opinion, in having such a friendly accessible clinic and I realised that this is one busy Health Centre doing its best to help the people in the area and achieving it (instead of somehow managing it).

I have worked in the Voluntary Sector for a long time and seen some of the most amazing things that people coming together can do. One of the best recent examples is the community reaction to the lockdowns during COVID. So many people across the country volunteered to help during that time and the Modbury community was no exception. We know that sometimes it's not easy to volunteer. Time is precious and sometimes it can feel like people are putting obstacles in your way with Health and Safety, policies, and procedures, but that is just the way of the world, and we must not let that put us off. These processes are necessary, after all, they are to help safeguard us and the rest of the community as we volunteer.

Britain has a long history of volunteering which can be traced back to the medieval times with more structured volunteering being developed in the 19th century. However, not everyone understands that what they are doing is volunteering. "I run a rugby club, I don't have time to volunteer.", "I am on the PTA that's not volunteering", "I don't have time to volunteer I am too busy helping with a few of my elderly neighbours". All of these and more are what volunteering is and add to the richness of society in this country.

What do you get out of volunteering? Studies show that volunteering is good for your mind and body, helps you to make new friends, expands your network and develops your social skills. Moving to Modbury as I did was a daunting task, particularly as it was in the middle of two lockdowns. Through volunteering, I have met a range of people and built several networks in a relatively short space of time. It has made me feel more at home and a part of the community.

Volunteering can also advance your career or get you back to work by increasing your knowledge, skills, and experience. Last, and by no means least, it's fun and fulfilling especially because you will be volunteering with a group of like-minded people.

I hope that you will look out for our future articles and enjoy hearing about some of the experiences we will be highlighting.
