ROYAL BRITISH LEGION – MODBURY BRANCH CELEBRATION OF THE CENTENARY OF FIRST FOUNDING OF THE MODBURY BRANCH - 15 DECEMBER 1923



The Modbury Branch of the Royal British Legion was first formed in the town on 15 December 1923, some two and a half years after the founding of, in those days, the British Legion which happened on 15 May 1921. Thus it was a great joy to receive the attached letter from the Devon County RBL President - Rear Admiral (Rtd) Chris Snow congratulating the Modbury Branch on reaching its centenary. This will result in the Branch receiving a special centenary pennant which will be flown at the top of the RBL Standard of the Branch. When this is delivered, it is hoped to arrange a special dedication and blessing.

However, the present Modbury Branch is thriving and is keenly looking forward to the next 100 years. The Branch now meets on the first Wednesday of every even month in The Club, Church Street, for a business meeting and usually on the first Friday of every odd month at a local hostelry for a social gathering. I write to offer my heartiest congratulations to you all at the Modbury Branch of the Royal British Legion on reaching the Branch Centenary.



Imagine going to the Bureau de Change with some old French Francs or German Marks you have found down the back of the sofa. They would be worthless bits of paper, but then the person behind the glass

exchanges them for pounds or Euros. You would walk away thinking, what an exchange - worthless paper for real money!

In the same way, Christians believe that God gives us a great exchange. He, in Jesus, takes our failure and sin away and gives us forgiveness, purpose and a place with him beyond the grave. Hiems



This Periwinkle is Vinca difformis that has decided to grow near the pond. Periwinkles grow particularly well in the west of Britain and are a common sight in Modbury. With their evergreen leaves and pretty much all year flowering, they are very welcome. The, more commonly seen, blue flowered, Lesser Periwinkle (Vinca minor) and Greater Periwinkle (Vinca major) are generally considered native though the Greater is most commonly associated with dwellings. All three species have a long history of medicinal use. Lesser Periwinkle was recommended by both Dioscorides and Galen (Greek 1st century AD) for toothache and "fluxes" (abnormal discharges). Commonly used to stop bleeding, in parts of Devon, it was called "cut finger". Another old name was Sorcerer's Violet due its potency against 'wykked spirits'.

Lord Francis Bacon (1561 to 1626) recommended tying the stems around the legs to relieve cramp. Culpeper, in the 17th century, says "The leaves of the lesser periwinkle, if taken by man and wife, will cause love between them"...

Vinca minor contains around 50 alkaloids including vincamine and reserpine. Vincamine is prescribed throughout Europe (but not UK) for the treatment of vascular dementia. Reserpine was, until relatively recently, used to treat hypertension (raised blood pressure). The Vinca alkaloids vincristine and vinblastine were discovered in the 1950s as useful anti cancer drugs. These are

now sourced from a closely related species Vinca Rosa known as Madagascar Periwinkle. These two drugs have drastically increased survival of children suffering from various leukaemias from 20% to 80%

"TAXI"

Modbury is a lovely place in which to live, but our transport system has been sadly lacking. Yes, a reasonable bus service calls once an hour each way between Kinasbridge and Plymouth, but as the last return from Plymouth is 18.15 hrs and from Kinasbridge 19.50 hrs, an evening of cinema, theatre or dinner at either end is not really possible. Driving and drinking is out, so the answer, in a lot of cases, is a taxi. That was fine until John Edwards retired during the pandemic, but luckily now Modbury has a new taxi service – and a serious one at that.

In February last year, after a lot of research and thought, Duncan Squires, a Modbury resident on Brownston Street, started Modbury Private Hire Taxis with a single taxi. Previously Duncan had been in the Army, REME, and left in 1989 but immediately joined the Reserves and subsequently served in Iraq & Northern Ireland amongst others. Being an engineer and fixer, as Gail, his wife, put it, he then managed a Plant Machinery firm in Exeter for some years, but subsequently left having decided he wanted to work for himself. Duncan and Gail had lived in Modbury since 2013, so the next step was to look for a business gap in the market in this area. As John Edwards had just retired, and Duncan enjoyed driving, the idea of a new taxi service unfolded. He stresses that John has been a tremendous help with advice and support for him in starting the business, so he took and passed all the tests and requirements needed for the job, bought a car and registered it as a taxi.

After nearly a year now, it seems his decision is vindicated as he is getting busier all the time. Duncan told me that having listened to the feedback from his customers, he has just taken on a second larger car so the firm now has both a 4-seater and a 6-seater car, and along with the second car comes an additional (currently part-time) driver, Tony. They offer a reliable, friendly, reasonably priced service for both local and long distance journeys, including airport transfer; he knows it is important that people are confident they will turn up as agreed. Prices are pre-agreed, and with pre-booking, e.g. for a night out, the return journey is discounted. A safe and comfortable service is paramount – he even carries an umbrella to help people out if it is raining. Duncan's wife, Gail, who retired from being an inspector for the Care Quality Commission last year, is equally

enthusiastic about the business and helps out on the phone, but mainly enjoys her leisure time out with their Fox Red Labrador, Cooper. They both enjoy the beaches round here, and with four children and a granddaughter between them, they are kept busy when the family visit. Duncan is also the Social Secretary of the local Royal British Legion, and as I write, Gail is currently busy helping paint the scenery and props for Oliver!

Modbury Private Taxi hire is surely a much appreciated start-up business for Modbury, and Duncan says he is looking forward to a busy 2024.

Modbury Parish Council Meeting

Tuesday 9th December 2023, 7.00 pm at the MARS Pavilion, Queen Elizabeth II Recreation MOIField.



Six councillors were present, apologies from Helen Nathanson and Dave Trigger. Four members of the public were present, also Rufus Gilbert (DCC) and Bernard Taylor (SHDC).

Public Forum: A member of the public raised the issue of the on-going flooding problems at Orcheton. Both MPC (Modbury Parish Council) and SHDC (South Hams District Council) have been involved in discussions with the various agencies for some time, but without success. Ann Turner agreed to join the action.

DCC Report: Rupert Gilbert confirmed that DIY material can now go to Devon recycling centres, but with restrictions on the amount and type of material.

Parishes have an opportunity to update or renew their applications for 20mph zones.

HS2 extra funding will be used for proper road resurfacing on the very poor section of the road to Brownston.

The £2.00 bus fare will continue until end 2024.

DCC has bought six replacement gritters.

SHDC Report: Bernard Taylor complimented MPC on the work they have done with SW Water over several months.

Lower income households can benefit from the Home Upgrade Grant to reduce energy bills. This is available to homeowners with an annual income of less than £31,000 who have heating that isn't mains gas and an EPC rating of D, E, F or G.

SHDC have a thermal imaging camera which can be used by anyone to see where their house may be losing heat.

SHDC subsidise the rental of eBikes.

Matters arising from the Minutes of MPC 5th December 2023: CCTV camera – to be followed up with the new police liaison officer; yellow lines on Barracks Road – DCC are close to doing this, along with those on Galpin Street; adoption of telephone box – preliminary approval has been given .

Finance: The budget for 2024-2025 as presented by the Finance Committee was approved. In general there is a 5% increase. This is insufficient to cover all likely expenditure in a busy year, but the budgeted shortfall of c.£4,000 will be covered by general reserves.

The precept for 2024-2025 is proposed to be £57,325 which is a 5% increase on last year and equates to an extra £3.33 pa for a Band D property

Grants were agreed to South Hams Community Action, Modbury Caring, and the Four Rivers Dementia Alliance.

Planning: Several planning applications were considered.

Noted were decisions made by SHDC on the Penn Parks proposed development. Further discussion needs to take place on potential \$106 monies, but the priority is to resolve access to the site and other issues.

Policy: To consider the new persistent or vexatious complaints and complainants policy – adopted;

To resolve to wind up the Ukrainian Working Group – since inception in May 2022, we have supported six households including ten individuals and six hosts, however, there is no current need.

To consider the revised Scheme of Delegation - Adopted.

To bring privately owned housing (previously social) back into social housing ownership – it was agreed that the clerk would request a meeting with LiveWest to discuss their provision in Modbury.

Highways; To consider the response from DCC regarding a feasibility study for the pedestrian crossing. The response from DCC was not helpful. It was agreed to request Callidus to provide a quote for this work as an extension to their current remit.

MPC has expended considerable time and effort in liaising with the SW Water contractors. Some relatively small issues with traffic flows in the works have been flagged up by the MPC and these will be further addressed forthwith.

MARS: The registration of a new charity with the object of enabling sports and recreation opportunities for residents of Modbury: actions required to progress, consider and approve were discussed - work continues on the relevant paperwork and agreements. A budget is agreed to pursue this. Further details will be examined at the February MPC meeting.


MODBURY BRIDGE CLUB


