



#### Grab Pots, Pans, Hats and Torches, it's Wassail Time

**Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> January** is the date for one of Modbury's great community events, the annual Wassail, when we give thanks to the trees in our community orchards and bless them for a good harvest in the autumn.

Those who attended the Apple Day pressing back in October will recognise Wassail as part of the life cycle of our orchards' year. Devon's reputation as 'cider country' dates back hundreds of years. The Wassail tradition is part of that heritage and has been revived and become more widely celebrated across the county and beyond in the last ten years or so.

Modbury is fortunate in having three community orchards: at the Queen Elizabeth II Recreation Field, the Millennium Meadow and the Galpin Street community orchard. All are cared for by volunteers who mow paths through the meadow grass to enable access to seats and to connect the Millennium Meadow and Galpin Street orchards, but otherwise let them naturalise to provide a habitat for wildlife.



The Wassail ceremony starts with a gathering by the Co-op in Burns Lane. Those attending are encouraged to arrive with old pots, pans and sticks to bang them. This is to make enough noise to drive out any unwelcome sprites and spirits who may still be lurking in the orchard. Before processing into the Millennium Meadow, we rehearse a few ancient Wassail carols that form part of the traditional ceremony.

We then set off for the orchard with much banging of pots and pans. We arrive to find the trees bedecked with candle lights, creating a quite ethereal atmosphere.

Once everyone has assembled on the lower path, our Town Crier will welcome everyone and introduce Mother Orchard (aka Charlotte Rathbone) who will lead the ceremony, starting with a welcome of representatives of the adjoining Galpin Street Orchard as they emerge at the top of the hill carrying flaming torches.

After the singing of a Wassail carol or two, the ceremony continues with this year's Wassail King and Queen, beating a token tree with a stick, then, using a forked stick, a piece of bread is dipped into our beautiful hand-turned Wassail cup into which has been poured some of last season's apple juice. The bread is then placed in a fork in the tree and the apple juice poured at the base of the tree in a symbolic 'circle of life',

While much of the Wassail ritual could be described as pre-Christian or pagan, these days we also benefit from the orchards being blessed by our community vicar, Revd. Matt Rowland.

The term Wassail is an Anglo Saxon greeting that means 'be of good health' to which the traditional reply is 'drink hael.' So, whenever the word Wassail is used, feel free to respond accordingly.

After the ceremony, celebrations continue with hot mulled apple juice and cider from October's pressing plus hot dogs cooked by the Cubs. Refreshments are provided free of charge but donations are welcome to help cover expenses.

Over the last few years, we have encouraged people to create their own Wassail hats, which are another



great part of the Wassail tradition. Simply take any warm, comfy hat and decorate it with ivy, feathers, berries, anything from the hedgerow and any eclectic nick knacks you feel inspired to add. It's really not possible to be too outrageous with a Wassail hat as our picture of other west country wassailers shows.

Come and join in Modbury's Community Wassail on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> January. We meet at 6:30pm by the Co-op in Burns Lane. Bring warm clothes, suitable footwear and torches or lanterns along with pots and pans. Don't forget your Wassail hat. See you there.

#### **CHRISTIAN COMMENT: The Perfect Present**

Weddings, anniversaries, birthdays, Christmas, all have one thing in common – presents. What presents are we going to give (what did we do last year?), and how much are we going to spend?

Not all presents are well received. A present may be **unsuitable**; children's toys, for example, often carry a warning of the danger of toddlers choking on small parts. We struggle to find the right article, and then find it's **unnecessary**, because they've already got one. People can be very choosy; if it's the wrong colour or style, it's **unwanted**, to be rejected or put out for the next jumble sale. And sometimes at the bottom of the drawer is a present that is **unopened**, and no matter how attractive the wrapping, the recipient will never get to enjoy what's inside.

Some people just don't want to have anything to do with Jesus. They may feel that Jesus is not for people like them or that they don't need religion in their lives. All too often they have been put off by the actions and attitudes of church people; Christians should hang their heads in shame.

Jesus is God's present to everyone. He offers forgiveness for every wrong we have done, no matter how great. He takes away all hatred, replacing it with love. He brings peace to lives which are in turmoil. This is good news indeed to an unhappy world. But a present has to be accepted, and a New Year is an ideal time to accept God's present and make a fresh start with Jesus.

#### An Apothecral Tail: Novum stagnum in Roslin Villa

#### **Hiems**



This feverfew plant is approaching the end of its flowering season. It has been in bloom since July and I have almost taken it for granted as other herbs came and went.


Feverfew (Tanacetum parthenium) is a common sight in gardens and hedgerows around Modbury. It apparently originated in Eurasia, but is now found worldwide. Feverfew has been used in traditional medicine for centuries. Its common name "feverfew" is derived from the Latin febrifugia meaning "fever reducer", though it is no longer considered useful for this purpose. Dioscorides (1st century AD) recognised feverfew as an anti-inflammatory. Culpeper, in the 17th century, noted that "it is very effectual for all pains in the head". Its use for alleviating fevers, headaches and arthritis gained it the nickname "medieval aspirin". Maud Grieve (1858 to 1941) in her herbals recommended feverfew additionally for psoriasis, allergies, asthma, tinnitus, nausea and vomiting.

Because of this long history of use in traditional medicine, feverfew is included in the European Union Herbal Monograph. This sets out standards of composition and appropriate tests to ensure consistent quality. It does not, however, indicate medicinal effectiveness. In fact there is no confirmed scientific evidence to support its various traditional uses and it is consequently not available as a licensed medicine.

However, feverfew is widely available as a herbal remedy and is commonly used. Feverfew does interact with many licensed medicines and should therefore be used with caution.

Feverfew contains **parthelonide** which is currently under investigation for the treatment of Cancer.



#### WILD GOOSE: Aladdin's Cave in Modbury

Wild Goose on Church Street, arguably one of the more intriguing shops in Modbury, is full of fascinating and often amusing memorabilia of all types. So I felt I had to visit, browse and talk to the owners Kay and Ty Freeman.



Kay and Ty have lived at and owned Wild Goose for the past 23 years - it has been an Antique Shop for 70 years. However, trends have changed and they have diversified over the past few years to fit in with changing times.

Their shop is certainly a modern Aladdin's Cave and is full of treasures. Sculptured hares and other animals abound; these are very popular as are the many interesting, amusing, sometimes naughty, large and small painted sians.

They also stock a large selection of greetings cards, some of which are quite wickedly funny. There are reclaimed wooden boxes of various sizes with the livery of old businesses from all over, including Modbury, and various English made pottery, with Cornishware the latest addition. Even though diverting from antiques, they still have a variety of old pine furniture.

#### **Modbury Parish Council Meeting**

#### Tuesday 5th December 2023, 7.00 pm at the MARS Pavilion, Queen Elizabeth II Recreation Field.



Seven parish councillors were present with an apology from Helen Nathanson. Gerry McAlister has stood down from the Council. If you are interested in joining the Parish Council, please contact the Parish Clerk. Seven members of the public were present and both South Hams District and Devon County Councillors were also present.

Public Forum: One parishioner expressed support for the council and the work they are doing.

**Devon County Councillor Report:** Rufus Gilbert highlighted the Fare Car service available from Modbury and surrounding villages to Ivybridge and Lee Mill on Tuesdays and Fridays and stated that they were looking at more stops in Modbury and the surrounding villages. The Fare Car service is proving very popular. More details are available on p.15 of this Modbury Messenger.

The Mobile Library service will cease in Feb 2024. Modbury Parish Council has expressed a possible interest in obtaining one of the Library buses, but this will be fully discussed at a later meeting.

Devon Highways are getting six new gritters.

**South Hams District Councillor Report:** Bernard Taylor reported that the recent bingo evening raised £1050 for Modbury Caring. **Planning:** 

3503/23/VAR Coach House, Back Street Variation to planning condition

Approved with the suggestion that the wall that is to be rendered is stone capped. The variation covers parts of the building not visible from the road.

3676/23/LBC Church Street Amendment to Listed Building consent Approved

**Devon Highways:** A way forward is being sought regarding the on-going flooding at Orcheton, It seems that no-one wants to take responsibility for the matter. A letter is to be sent to the relevant bodies to try and get some way forward.

**Maintenance Committee:** A parishioner has expressed interest in replacing the bench between Galpin St and Ayleston Cross. The Council welcomed the interest and further discussion will take place to ensure that everyone is satisfied with the bench design and position.


**MARS:** The work on setting up the trust is progressing, but this could take a long time due to the time the Charity Commission may take to finalise everything.





Modbury History Society will next meet at 7.30pm on Friday, 8th March 2024 when Dr Helen Wilson will speak about "Lady Woodcarvers to Professionals: the remarkable Pinwill Sisters". Dr Wilson has written a very special book about the Ermington sisters, whose work features in many churches in the area.

The Society meets at the MARS Pavilion situated in the QEII Recreation Field, in Chatwell Lane, Modbury, PL21 OFS, where there is ample parking. #### What is Fare Car?

Fare Car is a public transport service operated by Private Hire cars. Passengers book and pay separately but share the advertised timetabled journeys. Fare Car is not a subsidised individual taxi service for people to use whenever and wherever they wish.

#### Who can use Fare Car?

Fare Car is available to passengers of all ages, regardless of whether or not they live in the area where it operates.

#### How do I use Fare Car?

To use Fare Car you need to book in advance with the Private Hire company, normally with 24 hours notice. It has fixed arrival/ departure times and points in town but runs door-to-door in rural areas.

#### Where can I travel to?

Each scheme covers a designated rural area and serves specific points in town e.g. supermarket, hospital, leisure centre.





- 3. All the signal hoists are done using the various Country/National Ensigns and the International Code of Signals Flags.
- 4. Starboard Yardarm (Plymouth)-West, will have the event wording, (which sometimes is abbreviated only 7 or 8 flags can be flown).
- 5. Port Yardarm (Modbury)-East, will have the year. Answer Pennant (Ans) will indicate the start (when at the top) or end (when at the bottom).
- 6. 1st ,2nd ,3rd substitute flags will be used whenever a flag flown earlier/higher in the hoist is to be repeated. eg 2022 = 2,0,1stsub,3rdsub.
- 7. If there is a significant event which does take place, additional signal flag hoists will be arranged, subject to the note 1 above. However, all the above flag hoists are subject to change.


