VE Day in Long Park - 'Lest we Forget'

May 8th 2025 was the 80th Anniversary of the end of the Second World War in Europe - the day better known as 'VE Day' and on this day in 1945, Prime Minister Winston Churchill announced to the nation and the Commonwealth that hostilities in Europe were over and that the German army had signed an unconditional surrender.

So around the UK, on May 8th 2025, many people came out to join together and commemorate this momentous occasion. Church bells would be rung across the land at 6.30pm, beacons lit, and people would remember.



Unfortunately, in Modbury 'we' seemed to have overlooked this event and very little was advertised! So to ensure some continuity with other towns and villages, several residents of Long Park, at relatively short notice, 'mustered on the green' (a favoured place for 'our' gatherings - of which there have been several over the years) on the evening of the 8th May.

After enjoying a long, warm spell through April and early May, this was probably the coolest day for some time, but that didn't deter us and actually it warmed again in the evening and the weather was perfect.

Bunting, banners and flags were hastily erected and people met for refreshments accompanied by light music from the era of 1945. Some people even managed to share tales of 'where they were' on the 8/5/1945. One such person was our 'guest of honour', former Long Park resident, and I believe, Modbury's oldest - Ivor Davies. It was good to see Ivor and Kathy who were proud to show everybody some of Ivor's VE Day memoirs which had just taken front page - and more, in the Kingsbridge Gazette!

Brian Weeks proudly hung up Union Flag bunting which was flown on VE Day itself - apparently by his grandparents, he was quick to remind the gathering!

New residents also made an appearance, so it was a double opportunity to meet new neighbours as there have been a number of changes in Long Park over the past twelve months. Almost forty people sat and chatted on the green until nearly 8pm as the sun dropped over rooftops and a chill returned to the evening.

So a couple of hours was spent catching up on news, meeting new friends and reflecting on the sacrifice made by literally millions of people around the world, so we could enjoy an evening on England's green and pleasant land.

Modbury Parish Council Annual Meeting & Ordinary May Meeting

Tuesday 6th May 2025, 7:00pm



Present were eight councillors, and three members of the public. Apologies were received from Cllr Sarah Wyatt.

In the Annual Meeting, Cllr Barbara Price was re-elected as Chair and Cllr Phil Smith as Vice-Chair.

Public Forum

- There was a query about the appointment of SHDC for safety inspections of the play parks. It was pointed out that external inspections are required by our insurance and SHDC were the best option. Also, should problems arise, an external consultation is crucial.
- Road white lines in certain locations need attending to before the summer tourist season.

Planning

There were two applications brought by the Planning Committee before the meeting because of their importance to the community.

- Livewest Housing Association have applied to have the social housing on the Palm Cross estate, which they own, freed from the Section 106 requirement to sell at affordable value, should they need to sell. The Planning Committee recommended that we object to this change and this objection was approved by the meeting.
- The outline planning application by Bloor Homes for up to 75 dwellings and all other associated development, with all matters reserved apart from access on the Palm Cross Estate. This area is outside Modbury's designated development boundary. Other contentious issues include overload on local infrastructure, proposed percentage of affordable housing, both vehicular and pedestrian access, and the poor performance of Bloor Homes in their previous developments on the site on the adjacent site. Devon CC Highways Department have objected on various grounds. It was noted that Modbury residents have put in some serious and well-thought-through objections. The Council unanimously agreed to object to the application and will submit their formal document to SHDC. Devolution

Modbury Parish Council reiterated their thanks to the leader of SHDC, Cllr Julian Brazil, for coming to MPC last month to explain the background to the proposals to disband Devon CC into an, as yet undetermined, number of unitary councils. MPC will continue to monitor developments.

Maintenance

- Cllr Bill Cole is now Road Warden and his team is working diligently on the potholes in the parish. MPC can only be concerned with side roads and not the main roads.
- A new P3 coordinator is needed to oversee work on the public paths in the parish.

Traffic calming measures - Barracks Road

MPC to support an application for a sign to warn motorists that pedestrians may be in the road. It was noted that MPC have often urged DCC Highways to improve safety on Barracks Road and will do so again.

Community Engagement

- The telephone box will be refurbished and become a mini-museum/gallery under the auspices of the Heritage Working Group.
- Rosemary Parker and Helen Pickles put together a splendid display of past May Fairs in the Parish Office window.
- The Marvellous Modbury/Marigolds weekend saw a lot of tidying up work by councillors, traders and other volunteers. More support from the community would be appreciated.


May Fair Carnival Vintage Car Parade

A recent survey commissioned by the Bible Society and conducted by YouGov has come up with some surprising results. There has been a general view over many years that church attendance is falling, but the survey shows that since 2018 there has been a significant rise in church attendance across a broad range of denominations, particularly the Roman Catholics and Pentecostals. The age group showing the greatest rise in church attendance is "Generation Z", that is 18- to 24-year olds. Also the rise in attendance is greater among men than women. The Emporium is to be re-established at 5 Church Street as Iggy and Neill are vacating their shop, Fifth Sense. Gerry told me that this gives him the chance to establish a more strategic base for his men on the 'High Street', and the move is planned for the end of June. This struck me as a very easy move for Gerry himself, but a massive distance for his literally thousands of tiny soldiers!



Having talked to Gerry about this, he is really excited to be joining the 'High Street' traders and hopes his shop will continue to help to attract new visitors and customers to Modbury. His window scenes have intrigued and delighted locals and visitors alike for the past four years, usually depicting historic battles, and he hopes to continue to provide similar battle scenes for (as he put it) the great folk of Modbury who have been so supportive. He plans to feature some very local scenes depicting battles fought in and around Modbury during

the English Civil War, as featured on Time Team.



Gerry was at pains to say that he is very grateful to Geoffrey Fielden for giving him the opportunity to launch his business at his premises on Brownston Street back in 2021, and Gerry tells me further that he has recently been informed that his Emporium is most likely one of, if not the last, Toy Soldier shop left in England. Amazing indeed.

The timing for him has also been amazing, as he was due to move out from number 64 anyway, and was not sure where to go. He is so grateful to Iggy and Neill for giving him this great, and timely opportunity. He wishes them, as I'm sure Modbury does too, every success while they prepare to venture off to pastures new.

Evening Lecture at Shilstone:

Modbury's Civil War by Philip Photiou

Thursday 5th June at 7:00pm,

Devon Rural Archive, Shilstone House, PL21 0T

In this lecture, Philip Photiou will talk about the first Battle of Modbury in December 1642, and the second battle in February 1643. He will explain how events leading to the two battles led to the defeat of the Royalist army, and the impact this had on the Civil War in Plymouth and the South-West.

Philip is a local historian and has written several books, 'Plymouth's Forgotten War', a history of Plymouth during the Civil War 1642 to 1646, and 'The Wrath of Kings' and 'The Lamb of God', which are two of a three-part series set during the Wars of the Roses. For the purposes of his research, Philip has walked all over Devon and Cornwall and he has redefined the forts and battle sites in and around Plymouth.

Philip also works with Steve Johnson, author of the Cyberheritage social media channels doing historical



podcasts around Plymouth and other areas. He also leads a monthly tour of Drake's Island with Steve, and a small number of historical walking tours around Plymouth Hoe and the Barbican. Modbury Welfare Fund

The Modbury Welfare Fund is the new name for what was previously known as *The Fund for the Benefit of the Sick Poor in Modbury*. Established in 1915, this fund was merged in 1965 with five other smaller funds. These funds originated from individual legacy donations by parish residents. In changing the name of the fund to the

Welfare Fund, the Trustees hope to move away from the somewhat archaic name previously used.

The fund offers small, one-off grants to low-income Modbury parish residents needing financial support for welfare or health issues.

Previous grants have included the purchase of a wheelchair, food parcels during COVID lockdown, transport for a child to attend therapy and after-school care during a period of parental illness.

The Fund normally has in the region of approximately £3,000 each year to give out in small grants. Grant applications are accepted throughout the year. Grants can be given to Parish organisations if they show the funds will aid low-income individuals.

There is an assessment process undertaken by members of the fund and confidentiality in this role is of paramount importance to the Trustees.

Here is the list of speakers for the u3a general meetings that take place on the 3rd Monday afternoon ea month at the Watermark in Ivybridge.

16 June 2025 - Adam Hart-Davies. The talk will be "Taking the Piss out of London". Adam will explain why urine was collected in London for a major industrial operation on the North Yorkshire coast. He will also mention some songs and promote the straw bale urinal!

21 July 2025 - Simon Dell. An ex-policeman, Simon regularly guides visitors around one of his favourite haunts of Lundy Island. He is also a Dartmoor National Park Guide, a member of the Police History Society & the Devon and Cornwall Police Museum. Simon has published books on policing, Dartmoor Prison and, in 1997, was awarded an MBE for his work with the Dartmoor Rescue Group and Tavistock community. Simon will talk about "Sermons in Stone, Rev. Bray's Bardic Boulders". If you follow the Cawsic River, you might see carvings and dedications to Spencer, Burns, Shakespeare and Milton. Simon's talk describes the story of these stones and the intriguing life of Edward Atkyns Bray, the Vicar of Tavistock.

18 Aug 2025 - Zoe Harris. The talk will be on "The Waste Sector Landscape in the UK". Zoe is a senior manager with Suez Recycling and Recovery UK. Her talk will cover a broad range of topics including the waste sector landscape in the UK, public and private sector roles, what happens to your black bin bag waste, whether it is processed, buried or burnt. It will also cover waste legislation and the whole procurement process for waste contracts with local authorities.

15 Sept 2025 - Jacqui Felix-Mitchell. This talk, "From PR Professional to Garden Designer - a life of passion" looks at Jacqui's journey from PR professional to Garden Designer. She will talk about her work in Publishing, Marketing, Communications and Public Relations and then continue to her growing passion for all things garden design and what happened next.

20 Oct 2025 - Chris Robinson. Chris is an acknowledged expert on the history of Plymouth and a guide to important places in the city. The title of the talk is "The story of Plymouth Hoe, Barbican and City Centre" and it will be a historical, pictorial tour of the heart of Britain's Ocean City.

Diary of a Local Beekeeper – The Good and the Bad News

As the 2025 honey season enters its stride, Justine and Duncan have had to overcome some devastating winter events

Last winter was the worst I have ever known for bee colony wipe-outs, personally, locally and wider afield. Despite all the preparations we routinely make to ensure our hives enter the cold season in good shape, nevertheless we lost nearly our entire apiary at Yealmpton in early March. It seems, too, that this unprecedented event was replicated up and down the land – beehives suddenly becoming, like the Marie Celeste, emptied of bees, including the queen. Whilst our apiaries in and near Modbury were mercifully unaffected, it was still very upsetting to lose the hives we did, just as spring was appearing, and as yet, there has been no definitive reason produced as to why this phenomenon occurred. In my view, however, it was a combination of factors.

Firstly, we enjoyed a very warm, lengthy autumn, which resulted in the queens continuing to lay brood beyond the time when they should have pressed 'pause' for the winter. The presence of brood thus enabled the parasite Varroa mite to continue breeding in the lava cells later than normal and, significantly, after beekeepers had administered winter treatment for the reduction of Varroa numbers. As a result Varroa levels spiralled up again. Finally, I think the warm autumn yielded a lot of sub-standard pollen, lacking in essential nutrients – a poor food source for the bees. So, maybe a combination of late brood-laying, exhausted queens, poor food supply and high levels of Varroa infestation caused a tipping point which sadly, some hives could not surmount. This is my supposition, for what it's worth – I await the experts' diagnosis with interest.

However, now comes the good news! Most of our hives that did survive have benefitted enormously from the excellent spring weather this year. The long spells of dryness and warmth have enabled the colonies to rapidly expand in size and strength, plus generate good stocks of honey from the flowering oil-seed rape and abundant spring blooms. Of course, this rapid expansion has also encouraged the strongest hives to swarm early and already they are developing new queen cells which, when mature enough, will precipitate a swarm. Then, the old queen will leave the hive along with a large number of flying bees, aiming to set up another colony elsewhere. When the new queen hatches, she will leave on her mating flight, pursued by drones, before returning to the hive where, after a few weeks, she will start laying eggs, ensuring the colony continues to thrive, both in bee numbers and stores. Justine and I have had a busy May attempting to preempt swarms and build up our hive numbers to replace the winter losses. We have already 'false-swarmed' several of our strongest hives to this effect, which were bringing on queen cells. This involves removing the old queen, together with lots of brood, bees and food into another empty hive and placing it into another apiary, well away from the parent hive – in order to prevent the flying bees from returning to it – then allowing the original colony to hatch out the queen cells as usual. By this method, we can keep control of any potential swarm event, which if left to the bees' whims we would probably lose completely.

More good news is that Justine and I expect to be extracting honey before the end of May, so there will soon be supplies available from the Neale's Cavern in Modbury. We very much value all the great feedback we receive from customers, and hope you will continue to enjoy this locally produced honey.

PS: I found a dead queen hornet actually inside a hive the other day. I presume she had been trying to gain access, but the sentry bees had managed to overcome her successfully. I've included a picture of her – she is a hefty insect, so it must have been quite a battle!




