## Another Successful Town-wide Spring Clean

The good people of Modbury awoke on Marigolds Day 2019 to find that storm Hannah was not impacting the South Hams as much as expected. Gusty winds did not stop volunteers arriving at the Parish office at 10:00am to collect their tasks, tools and free Marigold gloves.

The town was soon buzzing with volunteers weeding, clearing and cleaning streets all over Modbury.

The area by the phone box in Lower Poundwell has been well and truly spruced up. The bent bollard has been reinstalled and even the phone box, one of the few still working, is due for a makeover once BT get their act together.

Quite a number of people, unable to be in Modbury on the day, had already done their bit beforehand and our call to extend beyond cleaning the town to enhancing it with more flowers and planters was met with an enthusiastic response. As well as colourful displays outside homes, there are now some twenty more planters situated around the town. Some were kindly donated; special thanks to the Modbury Society and Monica Yunnie, who also donated quite a number of plants she had reared from seed. Thanks too to the many traders who responded to a request from the Marigolds Day Team to put planters outside their shops.

The Lower Poundwell car park was well and truly spruced up ready for May Fair with countless bags of rubbish and weeds being rounded up. This good work was further enhanced by a team from the Fruit and Produce Show who installed and planted out new containers.



We estimate some 70 volunteers turned out for Marigolds Day 2019, many of them taking the opportunity for a well earned rest afterwards at the Pavilion where they could enjoy the tempting cakes, tea and sandwiches on offer, all generously donated and served by yet more volunteers.

We plan to make the planting an ongoing project for the town as it requires a lot more than one day a year to keep all the planters looking at their best. Many have been planted out but some are still awaiting warmer frost-free weather to be finished.

## MODBURY PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The May Parish Council meeting took place on May 14th at the Pavilion. We now have a new council as the old council stood down and a new one was going to be elected on May 2nd but as there were only 12 people who wanted to be on the council and there were 12 places available, no voting was required. The new council members are: Bernard Taylor, John Harvey, Bill Cole, Colin Whybrow, Jo Woodcock, Barry Keel, Peter Watts, Rob West, George Rosevear, Tom Coats, Margaret Middleton and Chris Barnes. Peter Watts was voted in as the new Chair and Margaret Middleton as the new Vice Chair.

**County Councillor** Rufus Gilbert reported that the 2018-2019 Devon budget was in balance. The road from Edmonston to Fancy will be resurfaced at night in October and that improvements to J29 of the M5 (Westpoint roundabout) are planned. There are approx 8000 miles of roads in Devon but 80% of the journey are made on 20% of these and consequently these are the roads that will get the most money spent on them.

The **Public Forum** was dominated by discussion about Modbury Memorial Hall's long-standing wish to use some of the current play park land for additional parking. This would require planning permission and District Councillor Bernard Taylor will seek the views of SHDC's planners. In early 2018, a contingency plan for mitigating any resulting loss of play facilities was initiated by Modbury Parish Council. An option to use the surrounding area for a new play park was considered. A grant was obtained for a topographic survey of the land so that the feasibility could be assessed. Subsequently a concept design was produced. Planned consultation on that design with parents and the school is on hold until the planning issue is resolved. In parallel discussions with SHDC and Bloor, the location of the toddler play area outside the old fire station is on hold also pending the above planning matter. MPC's view is that safety of the children would be better served by integrating all play facilities on the school side of Barracks Road.

During the **Public Forum** it was requested that thanks be given to Nick Owen and the rest of the May Fair Committee for all the work that went into organising this year's May Fair. It was also requested that a vote of thanks be given to the Modbury Fire Brigade for their prompt response to the fire in Brownston Street.

A question was asked about how long various footpaths would continue to be closed due to the flood relief. According to Cllr West, they should be open in the very near future.

The **Parking Group** asked for an update on the yellow lines in Brownston Street and was told that this is all to be reviewed at the same time as the problem of parking around the Co-op is discussed at the next meeting. The Parking Group are to hold a meeting with Modbury School and will report back at the next meeting.

The issue of the state of the land at Swanbridge Mill was raised as people have complained about it. This had been discussed at the last Parish Meeting and the owners of Swanbridge Mill had been given 6 months to tidy up and according to people progress has been made down there already.

The **Police Report** gave total crimes in Modbury from 7th April to 14th May to be 6 crimes broken down into 1 assault, 2 public order offences, 1 offence relating to the Communication Act and 2 thefts; this compared to 4 crimes in the same period last year.

**Planning:** 4 planning applications were considered and all either approved or passed with no objection.

The **Finance Committee** minutes and the annual financial returns were all agreed. The issue of a very high water bill from SWW for the Allotments (due to a leak) was discussed and the council gave its backing to the Allotments Society to carry on trying to get a better leak relief than that offered by SWW.

The Parish Council has various committees eg Finance, Maintenance and councillors were asked which ones they wanted to sit on, and also which non Parish Council committees eg Memorial Hall, TIC etc they wished to attend to report back to the Council. These were sorted and in the next Modbury Messenger there will be a short summary of each councillor and which committees they are on so that if you have queries you know who to contact.

Apparently the Woodland Trust has some packs for planting by community groups. More information can be obtained from <https://www.woodlandtrust.org.uk/plant-trees/free-trees/>.

The state of the Community Noticeboards in Poundwell was discussed and it was agreed that these need some refurbishment and looking after which the Parish Council will carry out.

The issue of a public electric car charging point for Modbury was discussed and it now appears that SHDC may be interested in pursuing this so this is being followed up with SHDC.

The Neighbourhood Plan has now had comments back from the various bodies and the Neighbourhood Plan Group are making amendments as required prior to it being shown to SHDC for their final comments and then it will be presented to the Parish Council for approval.

## The Vicar Writes:



Stage Directed by *Sarah Wyatt*, this was a hugely enjoyable west-end style romp with plenty of laughs and a twist in the tail. *Rob West* put the camp into campsite with some scene-stealing appearances as manager Guy Roper, supported ably by *Caroline Bower* and *Clare Owen* as the two CID officers on the trail of the robbers.

And there were some great summer songs for the audience to sing along with. Musical Director *Jo Highley's* band seems to get bigger with every show and, this year, an 8-piece ensemble led cast and audience through an uplifting selection of sunny tunes from the last 6 decades. Musical highlights included *Bring Me Sunshine*, *Here Comes the Sun*, *Walking on Sunshine*, *One Day Like This* and *Hi-Ho Silver Lining* – repeated, after raucous calls for an encore on both nights.

This was the first time the May Fair Singalong has run over two nights and both shows were sold out well in advance. With early evening performances from Modbury's wonderful school choir and many of our younger generation now working lights, sound and even puppets in the hall, it's good to know that the future of these events is in good hands.

The May Fair show's growing popularity suggests it's destined to become a regular fixture as the 'hot ticket' for the week. With some cheeky innuendo and a few 'realistic' expletives this was also a more adult show than Memorial Hall audiences have been used to, suggesting that the Modbury Players may have found an exciting way forward.




