

### MODBURY PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

Report of the Modbury Parish Council Meeting Tuesday 1st August 2023, 7.00 pm, The Pavilion, QEII Recreation Field, Modbury. Based on the Draft Council Minutes (please refer to minutes for full details).

Seven Parish Councillors were present, along with Rufus Gilbert, the Devon County

Councillor and five members of the public. Helen Nathanson from MPC and Bernard Taylor from SHDC sent their apologies.

**Devon Councillor's Report:** Rufus Gilbert reported that Devon County Council have progressed matters regarding the BT manhole at Goutsford. The proposal to close the mobile library service has been called in for scrutiny. The Church Lane disabled parking bays are being abused and it is proposed to change these to mandatory spaces for blue card holders. DCC has additional funding to re-do all the white give-way and stop lines at junctions in the County.

Modbury Parish Council commented that this was positive news, but that in Modbury the main concern was for the increasing problem with pot-holes. The Modbury road warden team will be doing a survey of all the pot-holes and will meet with DCC when this is completed.

**Church Lane Allotments** – there are still no sale details, but offers are welcome. One previous offer has been declined. The request for them to made a community asset is progressing.

### Planning

- a) 2070/23/HHO Householder application for dwellings extension Kingston Supported
- b) 1837/23/FUL Freestanding single storey agricultural/storage building, Bonny Moor, Field At Sx 6681 5216 Modbury

MPC is concerned that this is over-development of the site. There is concern that the slope downhill to the pond would create agricultural run-off from the land to enter the natural spring water. MPC note that the there is still a caravan on site despite this previously being a matter for enforcement. It was agreed that MPC cannot comment further on the application until the enforcement matter is resolved and requests that SHDC undertake a site visit.

**Community Engagement:** Proposal to establish a working group comprising Gerry McAllister and Sarah Wyatt and representatives from the traders and the community concerning supporting the life of Modbury high street was agreed. The group to agree Terms of Reference for approval at the next Council meeting.

**Sustainable Modbury:** Feedback from the recent meeting with SWW regarding the sewerage works in January 2024 resulted in two main issues being discussed:

- The proposed sewerage works in Modbury SWW's reason for a combined pipe rather than two separate ones is the extent of other utility sources under the road. They are currently undertaking research to see if they can use a different repair process that would reduce the length of time to complete the work.
- Modbury Treatment Works it was felt that SWW response to concerns was unsatisfactory and this is being pursued.

The Water Quality Group are seeking an second opinion from the Environmental Agency regarding both issues.

**P3** - Clearance work has taken place on FP1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 and a stile repaired on FP5. Work continues on the renewal of a finger post at Donkey Lane and the poor condition of the final stretch of FP3 will be considered at the next meeting of the Maintenance Committee.

### CHRISTIAN COMMENT: REMEMBERING TO SAY 'THANK YOU'

September is the time when many churches throughout the country hold a service of Harvest Thanksgiving, to thank God for his goodness. The tradition of celebrating Harvest Festival, in the way that we know it today, was first introduced in 1843 by Revd. Robert Hawker of Morwenstow, at a time when this country was primarily rural. As most people made a living from their fields, this was an opportunity to give thanks for being able to have the absolute necessities of life, unlike today, when we do not have to do without food if bad weather affects the crops, as we can obtain similar produce from abroad. This year, there have been problems with the weather and the supply and cost of some items, but generally, we can thank God for the products of his creation and for the miracle that a fruit tree or bush or a vegetable plant has been able to grow from a small seed.

'Thank you' are two of the first words that we learn to say as children, and possibly two of the first words we forget to say as Christians. We attend Harvest Thanksgiving Services, Remembrance and Memorial Services and other Services, where we say thank you to God for the work and lives of others, but how often do we personally say thank you to God for what he has done for us, or for those we have been praying for? Often our prayers are littered with the word 'please', but sparse on the words 'thank you' as we ask God for help or healing for ourselves and others.. But when he answers our requests, how often do we remember to say 'thank you'? Are we like the nine of the ten lepers who had been healed by Jesus who were so overjoyed at no longer being outcasts of society, that they went straight away to get on with their lives again? Or are we like the other leper who was so overjoyed that he came back to thank Jesus for his healing?

There are many different ways of saying 'Thank You' to God, for his countless blessings and for listening to us when we pray. In our church services we use four different types of prayer - adoration, confession thanksgiving and intercession - and each one is as important as the others so maybe we could use that pattern for our own prayers too?



# Community Orchard Harvest Looks Good for Apple Day Pressing

Unwelcome though the rain may have been for holiday makers, it has been a boon for gardeners and our community orchards. This year's apple crop looks bountiful, so we are all set for our annual **Apple Day on Saturday October 14th**.

Our apples are usually harvested after the hay in the orchards has been cut and raked up. The grass is left as meadow grass for the rest of the year to provide a wildlife habitat. Community orchard volunteers work in co-operation with the school at harvest time so that the children are able to engage with the entire juice-making process, from harvest to subsequently washing, chopping (or scratting) the apples before the pulp is placed in the press. When the juice starts to flow, it is captured and bottled ready for pasteurising or freezing.

### Volunteers needed to help with apple pressing

This year the pressing will take place at the **Little Kitchen yard** in the centre of town. Children and parents are encouraged to come along to both observe and be involved. Adult volunteers are particularly needed this year to help with the different stages of pressing and to supervise younger helpers. So, if you can spare a few hours from **10:00am on Saturday 14<sup>th</sup> October**, please contact Ann Turner

### Bring out your bottles . . . and your apples.

Donations of clean screw-top bottles are always welcome. We need them in advance so that they can be sterilised. If you have some bottles to donate, please contact Colin Whybrow <a href="mailto:cwhybrow@btconnect.com">cwhybrow@btconnect.com</a> and we can arrange to collect the bottles. If you have apple trees, your own harvest probably also looks good this year and you may have surplus apples to donate to Apple Day. Just bring them along on the day and we can include them with those from our community orchard in the Millennium Meadow, where we grow many traditional Devon varieties. Our Galpin Street Community orchard is not yet mature enough to develop a meaningful crop and a small number of trees have not survived the winter and will need replacing.

### What do we do with the juice?

Some of the juice is made available to take home after the pressing for a small donation, which helps cover the cost of hiring the press and purchasing other items that we need. It is also served at community events such as the Wassail when it is usually offered as hot mulled apple juice; very welcome and absolutely delicious on a cold January evening when the Wassail is held.

### **River Erme Councils**

### Who we are

We represent the six Town and Parish Councils whose catchment includes the River Erme and the streams which flow into it. Modbury Parish Council has joined forces with the other councils in order to pool resources and share information and ideas about addressing the pollution in the River Erme and the Mothecombe Estuary.

### Why have we done this?

Water quality is a public health and environmental issue which affects all of us and the plants and creatures living in and near the river. The Erme flows into the Mothecombe Estuary. A recent report by South West Water identified sources of pollution including run off from fields, discharge from Sewage Treatment Works particularly after heavy rain, and discharge from private treatment plants. Pressure on drainage is increased by demands from development and increasing unpredictability of weather.

Mothecombe and Wonwell beaches are popular destinations for locals and tourists. The estuary is home to a wide variety of birds and marine creatures and because of this is designated as a Site of Special Scientific interest which should be protected. We believe that we have a responsibility to address these issues on behalf of our communities.

### What we are doing?

Engaging with the Local Planning Authority (South Hams District Council) to ensure that the issue remains high on their agenda. Ensuring that drainage and water quality issues are routinely considered in all planning applications.

Working with local action groups and organisations to highlight the challenges in our area and be informed about examples of good practice.

Supporting funding applications and, where appropriate, providing funding. Working with local voluntary groups who are monitoring the water quality. Modbury and Holbeton Councils have funded testing kits for use by volunteers after appropriate training.



### Potholing in Modbury!

No, not the pastime of scrambling down and through cave systems, but the serious business of repairing potholes on the roads around the parish!

One of the most common sources of complaint heard around the town and in the Parish Office is the state of our roads. Responsibility for maintenance of all adopted roads rests with Devon County Highways. However, repeated budget cuts over the years have meant that resurfacing programmes are much curtailed and pothole repairs have been limited to only the most dangerous locations – basically where the hole exceeds 300mm in diameter with a **vertical** face of more than 40mm.

As a way of addressing the problem, Modbury Parish Council has renewed its involvement in the Devon Road Warden Scheme. Rob West has volunteered to take on the role of Road Warden reporting to the Parish Council's Maintenance Committee. A survey of all the parish's adopted roads is being undertaken, reporting all actionable potholes to the Highways Department at County Hall.

We are now looking to recruit a team of volunteers willing to undertake more minor pothole works on an occasional basis. So, if you are reasonably fit, have some spare time and wish to make a much-valued contribution to the community of Modbury, please register your interest or seek more information on what is entailed by contacting us. - 4.Starboard Yardarm (Plymouth)-West, will have the event wording, (which sometimes is abbreviated only 7 or 8 flags can be flown).

### An Apothecral Tail: Novum stagnum in Roslin Villa


A recent skirmish in the ongoing Bamboo War has resulted in considerable collateral damage around the pond. One casualty was the long anticipated flowering of the monkshood (Aconitum napellus). I shall have to wait another year to celebrate the properties and uses of this icon.

About two feet away from the much mourned monkshood is this **valerian** (Valerian officinalis)

Valerian (Potassium Bromide and Valerian Mixture)

Extract of the valerian root is still commonly sold in herbal medicines for sedation and sleep, but this is based on its long traditional use for this purpose. There is little clinical evidence to support its use for this purpose and consequently there are no licensed medicines on the market.

Interestingly in 1592, Fabio Colonna wrote a book describing how he had cured his own epilepsy using valerian root. Valerian contains a number of phytochemicals, among them **valeric acid**, a derivative of which is **valproic acid** a leading drug used for treating epilepsy. Valproic acid was



Despite the name, this plant is not closely related to the **red valerian (Centranthus ruber)** which is widely seen around Modbury most notably growing in walls. Red valerian is a relatively recently introduced garden escapee originally from the Mediterranean. It gets its name from the superficially similar appearance of its flowers to true valerian. Red valerian has no known medicinal properties.

Valerian officinalis is a native plant with a long history of use in medicine. It was mentioned by Hippocrates (460 to 370BC), "the father of medicine" Galen (129 to 216 AD), "the father of pharmacy", prescribed it for sleep. Its species name "officinalis" refers to its inclusion in the Pharmacopoeia Londensis (around 1620) when Thomas Culpeper referred to its beneficial use for treating cough and even plague. In my early days in pharmacy, many prescribed medicines were made in the pharmacy and my job was to prepare stock bottles of commonly prescribed preparations.

Among these was Mist. Pot. Brom. et Valerian.

Interesting also, is the fact that during the time of both world wars, Germany was the dominant manufacturer of medicinal substances. During the wartime blockade of Britain, there was a real shortage of many medicines. This led to the setting up of County Medicinal Herb Committees. Organisations such as the WI and Scouts and Guides were given instructions on how to forage medicinal plants particularly foxglove and valerian. Drying rooms were set up to dry the plants to prevent degradation of the active principles. I wonder how this worked out in Modbury, a potentially rich source of medicinal plants.
